Bachelor and Graduate Students

Study Grants — »Studienstipendien«

Gain specialized knowledge and advance in your academic field! Our study grants (cost of living/travel/tuition fees up to a certain limit) are open to bachelor's graduates from universities and universities of applied sciences, master's students, and young professionals who are eager to get a taste of US master's programs, explore life in the USA away from the tourist centers, and expand their intercultural skills.

Research Fellowships

Interested in manufacturing innovation or software engineering? These new fellowships (cost of living/travel) offer hands-on research experience in one of the Fraunhofer USA research centers. Bachelor's graduates and master's students in the fields of engineering and technology are invited to join the centers' research groups and experience how processes and products are developed for entrepreneurial use.

Travel Grants — »Reisestipendien«

Thinking of studying in the USA via a partnership agreement of your German university? Join the Fulbright network through our travel grants (travel/incidental costs) on the undergraduate/graduate level.

Pack your bags and excite US students about Germany! If you are an advanced student of teaching English/American studies, these grants (cost of living/travel) offer unique opportunities as assistant teachers and campus ambassadors of German culture at small US universities.

Early-Career Scholars and University Lecturers

Doctoral Grants — »Doktorandenprogramm«

Young researchers pay attention: Start building your transatlantic networks and benefit from the international environment and renown of US university research. These grants (cost of living/travel) are for doctoral students and help finance dissertation-related research at a US university.

Research and Teaching — »Forschung und Lehre«

Want to spend your sabbatical in the USA? Our travel grants (travel/incidental costs) support postdoctoral scholars who wish to engage in teaching/research at US universities or research institutes and expand their transatlantic networks.

Fulbright-Cottrell Award

Seeking excellence in both research and teaching, the Fulbright-Cottrell Award helps to develop outstanding German teacher-scholars. It provides a 3-year grant to complete a combined teaching/research project in physics, chemistry, or astronomy and offers entry into the community of American Cottrell awardees.

Study and Research

Program for English Teaching Assistants

Interested in teaching about the USA?

These grants (cost of living/incidentals/travel) offer bachelor's and master's graduates a unique opportunity to give German students an authentic image of their country. As English language teaching assistants in German schools, they create new learning opportunities for American studies and spark their students' interest in the USA.

Lecture and Research & Intercountry Lectureship Grants

Germany offers a vast and varied research landscape, including more than 400 universities. Excellent research and teaching is not clustered in just one or two exceptional institutes but takes place all over Germany. Our lecture and research grants (cost of living/incidentals/travel) offer post-doctoral scholars a wide selection of institutions with which to collaborate. Their engagement also includes guest lectureships at other universities in Germany and Europe, financed through the Intercountry Lectureship Grants.

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Bachelor Students

Leaders in Entrepreneurship

From lab to market: what can we learn from the entrepreneurial spirit in the USA? Currently hosted by Louisiana State University just outside New Orleans, this seminar is tailored to young German bachelor's students in the technical/engineering sciences interested in developing a business of their own and engaging with the unique culture of the deep American South.

3 weeks in August/September

Intercultural Communication Summer Institute

Leadership and communication across cultures are just two of several pillars of our summer institute at Michigan State University. We invite young German bachelor's students in cooperative university programs (Duale Hochschulen) to the city of East Lansing, situated close to the Great Lakes. Courses and site visits deal with the various concepts of entrepreneurship, social innovation and service learning in a global business environment.

Summer Institutes — »für Fachhochschulstudierende«

Today's challenges are complex and often interconnected. The summer institute at Virginia Tech, »Communicating Across Disciplines«, discusses what skills scientists, engineers, and entrepreneurs must develop to successfully connect across differences in cultures, traditions and attitudes.

The program supports young German bachelor's students from the universities of applied sciences whose academic background connects with the program topic.

Diversity Initiative

Welcome to life and study in Texas!

Trinity University's summer institute offers an insight into American undergraduate studies with a special emphasis on US history, education and current debates on diversity and multicultural spaces. Students attend classes, engage on campus and explore the cultural and political life in the San Antonio area. Young German bachelor's students of migrant background are invited to apply for this summer institute.

Berlin Capital Program

What's on the news in Germany?

The one-week Berlin Capital Program affords firsthand insights from Germany's capital, expert discussions about politics in Germany and Europe, and various meetings with German media. The program expands the professional perspectives and networks of US journalism students and early-career journalists interested in covering and »translating« the news on this side of the Atlantic.

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Teachers

Diversity and Inclusion in the Classroom

In need of tactics to teach diverse classrooms? The rise in ethnic diversity presents opportunities and challenges in US and German schools. Aimed at German teachers, the seminar at Ohio State University addresses new trends in US education politics, such as equity, diversity, special education, and inclusion. During school visits, German participants explore how teachers and school leaders can create positive learning environments for students to feel included, regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, culture, perspective or experience.

Early-Career Researchers and Specialists

American Studies Award

Innovative research welcome! Post-doctoral scholars with an interdisciplinary research project in the field of American studies are invited to apply. Co-funded by the German Society for American Studies (DGfA), the award helps finance project-related research and exchanges with colleagues in the USA.

Fulbright Specialist Program

Agile specialist responses to field-driven initiatives — the specialist grants (cost of living/travel expenses) support short-term German-American collaborative projects in higher education. Projects may range from conference cooperation, joint workshops and faculty training to curriculum development and needs assessment.

University Administrators

Workshop for German Administrators in International Education

Building academic exchanges with the USA is at the core of this intensive advancement program for German university administrators in international education and career services. Personal meetings with their peers during the Seminar for US Administrators in International Education provide close insights into the strategies and interests American universities pursue in initiating and maintaining international partnerships.

Seminar for US Administrators in International Education

Internationalization on the Decline? The share of US universities putting campus internationalization on the top of their agenda has dropped. This advancement program seeks to interest US administrators in international education in new prospects and innovative models for academic exchanges with Germany and the broader European context. Personal meetings with their German counterparts help to establish a professional network for the development of sustained institutional partnerships.
